**RESPONDENT’S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO OPPOSE MOTION FOR SUMMARY DECISION**

Counsel for Respondent HomeAdvisor, Inc. (“**HomeAdvisor**” or “**Respondent**”) respectfully moves to extend the time for HomeAdvisor to oppose Complaint Counsel’s motion for summary decision. Complaint Counsel do not oppose this motion.

The motion for summary decision was served on HomeAdvisor on April 7, 2022, and HomeAdvisor’s deadline for opposing the motion therefore is April 18, 2022 (two weeks following the first business day after the service date). Complaint Counsel’s filing totaled over 8,000 pages and was supported by, *inter alia*, the declarations of 19 individuals—including 15 previously undisclosed third parties. To provide HomeAdvisor with additional time to oppose the motion, including to account for the unavailability of certain counsel for HomeAdvisor during the week of April 18, 2022 due to religious observances, HomeAdvisor requests, and Complaint Counsel do not oppose an extension to **May 27, 2022** at 5 pm to allow the opportunity to serve subpoenas on,

and take the depositions of, the individuals who submitted declarations in support of the motion for summary decision.

Upon the filing of a motion for summary decision, the Commission may “permit affidavits to be supplemented or opposed by depositions, answers to interrogatories, or further affidavits” and “may order a continuance to permit affidavits to be obtained or depositions to be taken or discovery to be had.” 16 C.F.R. § 3.24(3)-(4). Because Complaint Counsel’s motion for summary decision relies on the declarations of 19 individuals, additional time is needed to take the depositions and discovery of such declarants. HomeAdvisor reserves all rights to challenge the propriety, and all other aspects of, the motion for summary decision.

Counsel for HomeAdvisor have met and conferred with Complaint Counsel, and as reflected herein, Complaint Counsel do not oppose the proposed extension. The extension will not delay other procedural deadlines or the hearing date set for November, 9, 2022.

For these reasons, the Respondent respectfully requests that the Commission enter the attached proposed Order extending the deadline to oppose the motion to **May 27, 2022**.
