Proposed Activities: Scope of Work, Staffing and Budgeting

The Request for Application summarizes the six broad business practices to be audited, as ordered by the Court. Each of these categories includes several components. The Court's order directs that the chosen ICA prepare, within ninety (90) days of the Effective Date, a first year budget and work plan. (Order p.21, ¶K.1.) No applicant will be able to reasonably project the necessary scope of work, staffing and budget until after selected.

The audit function will require a thorough understanding of Herbalife's business, information technology systems, past practices that gave rise to the Court order and proposed changes to practices and information collection and retention. During the 90-day window the ICA should meet, probably several times, with Commission staff and Herbalife management and legal counsel. Only after establishing a baseline understanding will the ICA be able to determine appropriate staffing (including appropriate subject matter expertise and experience levels) and prepare a budget. As the Court's order contemplates, staffing and budgeting should be a collaborative undertaking among the ICA, Commission and Herbalife.

My expectation is that staffing decisions and budget projections will follow the successful pattern we have developed during our RVG receivership. RVG was a multi-level marketing ("MLM") business that was determined by the SEC and federal court to be a massive Ponzi and pyramid scheme. As receiver, my team and I have developed in depth knowledge and understanding of MLM practices, pricing, marketing, compensation structures and regulatory requirements. We have marshalled over \$361 million and made distributions to qualified claimants at a rate of 60% of claims. The return rate to qualified claimants is expected to reach at least 75%. McGuireWoods and its consultant, FTI Consulting, have billed fees to the receivership of only approximately 5% of total recoveries over the first four years of the receivership. The cost efficiency and percentage of returns to qualified claimants may be unprecedented for a federal receivership.

As with the RVG receivership, I envision a relatively small core group of attorneys and paralegals being tasked with the majority of ICA responsibilities. Even though the RVG receivership is a massive undertaking, the core team at MW consists of three associates, two partners with split responsibilities, one senior counsel and a paralegal. Other timekeepers consist of MW professionals and paraprofessionals working in specialized capacities, such as bankruptcy, tax, employee benefits and information technology, who are consulted for limited purposes and who charge limited time to the receivership. This structure is purposeful, effective, and efficient for the receivership, as the attorneys most experienced in their field are conducting certain key portions of the receivership work.

In support of the Herbalife ICA, a very limited number of MW partners should be required to establish goals and procedures, and provide oversight and decision making. The

majority of work should be performed by firm associates of all experience levels and paralegals. A "bottom heavy" staffing model will control fees while accomplishing the compliance audit function. Preferably only one partner, in addition to me, would be assigned to this engagement. Depending upon the practice areas required to address all of the Court's directions it may be necessary to divide the work among several partners. For instance, the audit function may be best addressed by a corporate attorney as to some issues, a data privacy and security attorney for others, a labor and employment attorney, or a compliance and regulatory attorney for the balance. I do not now have a sufficient understanding of the scope of work to make specific recommendations. In any event, associates with the necessary experience will be able to execute most tasks.

Our normal practice is to engage in detailed discussions with our clients to develop agreed-upon work plans and cost estimates that fit the work required. This is important both to establish clear expectations and to preserve the independence of our work by ensuring that the budget is adequate to the scope of the work required. We would similarly work with the Commission and Herbalife in developing a work plan and budgets.

During my four years as RVG receiver my team and I have filed Quarterly Status Reports and Fee Applications with the Court, so we are experienced with submitting reports to the Court and operating within a budget; the Court has never denied or reduced a submitted fee application.

Conflicts

McGuireWoods is not aware of any conflicts of interest that would prevent us from serving as the Independent Compliance Auditor (ICA) for Herbalife. Jerry Kilgore, the former Attorney General of Virginia, is a Senior Advisor with McGuireWoods Consulting, a subsidiary of MW. Mr. Kilgore has been on a monthly retainer with Herbalife to deal with any inquiries from state Attorneys General. Mr. Kilgore has not undertaken any representations of Herbalife as a result of this retainer, and will resign his engagement with Herbalife in the event that I am selected as ICA. The Conflicts Clearinghouse section of MW is aware of this application and Mr. Kilgore's retainer and is satisfied that no ethical conflicts exist.
