Dear Mr. Lewis:

Thank you for your March 6, 2014 comment in the above-referenced matter. Your comment was placed on the public record pursuant to Section 2.34 of the Commission Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 2.34.

You express concern that ADT turned off your service without your knowledge, with the result that you would not have been able to alert authorities in case of a medical emergency. The proposed complaint is limited to allegations that ADT used paid expert spokespersons to promote the ADT Pulse without adequately disclosing the material connection between the experts and ADT. Although the complaint does not address conduct relating to improper termination of service, the Commission is committed to protecting consumers from any unfair or deceptive acts or practices in commerce and has forwarded your comment to the FTC's Consumer Response Center.

After considering your comment, along with others received in this matter, the Commission has determined that the public interest would best be served by issuing the Decision and Order in final form without modification.
